# Media Release

## Police Investigate Home Invasion Robbery

On March 13, 2009 at 2:40 AM police responded to a reported home invasion robbery in the 100 block of Conjuror's Drive. Upon arrival, police met with victims who reported that they were in a garage at the rear of the residence when three suspects entered and demanded money. Two of the suspects displayed firearms during the robbery. The five victims were tied up and robbed of their wallets. During the hour long robbery, the victims reported being assaulted by one of the suspects. Prior to the robbery, a witness observed a suspicious vehicle in the area and provided a description to police.

At 2:47 AM police received a call of shots being fired in the 200 block of Biltmore Drive. Upon arrival, police were advised by the resident that he was awakened by noises outside of his home. The resident looked outside and observed two suspects near his vehicle. The resident exited his home with a handgun. Once outside, the resident observed the two suspects still near his vehicle and was surprised by a black male crouched down next to his porch. After being startled by the suspect at the porch, the resident fired shots into the air causing the three suspects to run in the direction of Homestead Drive.

Officers canvassed the area and located a vehicle matching the description of the vehicle seen prior to the robbery on Conjuror's Drive parked in front of a residence in the 200 block of Homestead Drive. Police established surveillance of the residence. During the surveillance, a male exited the residence and was confronted by officers. The suspect, matching the description of one of the Conjuror's Drive suspects, was in possession of a firearm. The suspect was taken into custody. Some time later, a second male was observed exiting the residence and was arrested.

Police obtained a search warrant for the residence on Homestead Drive. The third suspect from the Conjuror's Drive robbery surrendered to police and exited the Homestead Drive residence. The Chesterfield County Police Department tactical team assisted with the arrest of the third suspect and execution of the search warrant.

Charges are pending against the three suspects who are currently in police custody. Preliminary investigation reveals that the crimes were not random and the victims were specifically targeted by the suspects.
